

Post-operative Instructions Knee Arthroscopy **Shea K. Taylor, MD**

- Weight-bearing status: Bear weight as tolerated. You may require crutches initially after surgery for balance and protection.
- Range of motion is very important after surgery. You may also begin bending your knee immediately after surgery.
- Icing: You should ice the knee for the first few days after surgery. Do not let ice come into direct contact with the skin (wrap ice bag with a towel or cloth). Ice the knee for 20 minutes on and 20 minutes off several times throughout the day.
- Pain control: You may alternate between anti-inflammatories and Tylenol every 4 hours beginning immediately after surgery. You have also been prescribed a short-acting narcotic to help with pain control after surgery. This may be necessary for a few days after surgery; however, you should come off the narcotic medication as soon as possible and transition to over-the-counter anti-inflammatories and Tylenol.
- Infection prevention: You have been given intravenous antibiotics during surgery to help with infection prevention.
- Dressings: May be removed 48 hours after surgery.
- Showering: It is okay to shower for surgery, however, do not soak the incision scrub the incision sites.
- Follow-up: This is usually about 2 weeks after surgery. Please contact the office with any questions regarding your follow-up appointment.
